Update After Two Years. July marked two years since the Rojas family moved into Gloria Dei's Room 99 apartment. While they await a decision on their asylum claim, they have made great strides in settling into life here. Each in their own way, the Rojas family has been busy this summer. Stephanie works full time at a child care center nearby. She loves the toddlers she spends her days with and often is called upon to translate, now that she's bilingual. Luis is juggling occasional work with a friend, exercising and spending time with Sebastian. Luis is looking forward to returning to work in food service for the St. Paul Public Schools this fall. Now 9 years old and heading into fourth grade at Expo, Sebas has attended summer school and played baseball. He is nearly fluent in English. His latest passions are Lego kits with lots of pieces and anything Harry Potter. On weekends the family goes to the pool or bikes to Lake Nokomis. Like many of us, they are looking forward to ending the summer with the Great Minnesota Get-Together (the State Fair).

Help Serve Loaves & Fishes. It's Gloria Dei's turn to serve Loaves and Fishes again. Every other month a team from Gloria Dei provides the evening meal at the St. Paul Opportunity Center in downtown St. Paul for people struggling with hunger and homelessness. This month we consider lifetime activities. This week the focus is on movement that helps us feel calm and centered: spending time in parks and meditative walking. Slowing down a little feels right in hot weather, and it is good for mental health too. Engage your senses. Practice observing things: shapes, colors, patterns, sounds, scents, how the air feels. Let yourself feel calm and appreciate the world God has made. The featured Olympic host cities for this week are Mexico City (1968) and Rio de Janeiro (2016). The high elevation in Mexico City affected track and field, aiding sprinters, but hampering distance runners. The US brought home 107 medals, followed by Russia with 91. In Brazil, the first country to host Summer games entirely during its winter season, the US won 121 medals, followed by China with 70 and Great Britain with 67 medals.

Land Acknowledgment Statement

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church recognizes that its building stands on traditional Dakota land near Bdote Mni Sota, the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers, the center of creation for Dakota people and also sacred to Ojibwe. The congregation acknowledges that this land was taken from Indigenous people by exploitation and violence. Given the deep significance of this sacred ground, as well as its painful history, the congregation recognizes its responsibility to use this land, its building and mission for the work of reconciliation and healing with Native people. The congregation repents of this injustice that continues to harm Native communities and pledges to work for justice, peace and the wellbeing of all creation.
