Be Part of the Sanctuary Sound Experiment March 2

In order to ensure that we welcome all people, we continue to work on the sound system in the sanctuary. Many have had difficulty understanding the spoken word. The Facilities Team and the Congregation Council have proposed an augmentation to our system. The congregation voted to apportion funds at the annual meeting. On Sunday, March 2, we will have an opportunity to test the equipment and changes to our system before we sign a contract. Although it means an awkward Sunday with cords, lifts, ladders and



obstructions, it will be an important step in the process of discernment. If you have had

Lent Starts on Ash Wednesday, March 5

In these days when chaos arrives each day in so many ways, we come to Lent yearning to find the places where we can be nourished, not only to survive but to be agents of hope and "repairers of the breach," as Isaiah promises.
