Winter Wellness: Self-Care. Have you heard the phrase, "You can't pour from an empty cup"? This week's goal is to balance your day by taking breaks. Self-care is important to health because it helps us to recharge, refocus and manage stress. It can reduce the risk for burnout and help people recover from it. There are many options: getting up to move, go for a walk, a cup of tea, a word puzzle. doodling, having a conversation, listening to music and time for meditation or prayer. Try setting a timer and resting with your eyes closed for 5 minutes. Aim for a couple of breaks every day, try different ideas and choose something that will restore your energy. Taking breaks is a way to keep your cup filled so you will be able to care for yourself, and care for others too.
