You Shall Be a Watered Garden

Pastor Osheta Moore, author of "Dear White Peacemakers," and Community Life Pastor at Roots Moravian Church in the Midway neighborhood of St. Paul, is working with Gloria Dei for the year to deepen our mission for racial justice. During Lent, she focuses on activism that is centered in prayer and contemplation on the beloved community. This Wednesday, she will lead worship, providing a spiritual practice to nourish and guide us. Following worship, she will engage confirmation students, 7th-10th graders, in the sanctuary. Adults are invited to listen in from the back of the church. At 7:30, she will stay an additional half hour for adults and youth who would like to have more conversation.

Each Wednesday in Lent, we will explore together a different spiritual practice to help ground us, finding living water that is our source for peace, freedom, and a joy that transcends life's difficulties. Next week Director of Musical Ensembles and Composer in Residence Dennis Friesen Carper will teach us about singing that is like praying a mantra, a repetitive set of words that calm the racing mind, connect us with one another, and bring us deeper into the Spirit.

In describing his unique sketches on his church's Sunday bulletins, John writes: "My mother, when I was probably about 5 years old, gave me the church bulletin and said I needed to occupy my time at church by drawing pictures. A lot of my first pictures were just doodles, small fabrications to keep my mind occupied instead of bouncing around the room, and to keep me focused on what the pastor was saying." Social Justice and Outreach

Second Offering for the Food Markets on Montreal, Neighborhood Houses's new Food Shelf. The focus of March's Second Offering will be to collect money to support the food programs at Neighborhood House. This is FoodShare Month, so financial matches from Second Harvest and The Food Group multiply Neighborhood House's buying power by eight times. A \$35 donation buys \$280 worth of food; a \$150 donation has \$1,200 of purchasing power. You can give digitally anytime at tinyurl.com/gd2NDOFF25 or by putting a check in the offering plate with "Second Offering" written on the memo line. The need is great. Neighborhood House serves over 1,700 unique families in a month—nearly doubled from this time last year. Last year's Gloria Dei Second Offering total of \$3,063 would have purchasing power of \$24,504 this year. We've set this year's goal at collecting \$4,375 for a purchasing power of \$35,000, or 10% of Neighborhood House's 2025 goal of raising \$350,000 during Foodshare Month. Do you still want to give food? Drop nonperishable food items in the red barrels right inside the parking lot doors. Each week the collected food is delivered to the Food Market on Montreal. Land Acknowledgment Statement

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church recognizes that its building stands on traditional Dakota land near Bdote Mni Sota, the confluence of the Minnesota and Mississippi rivers, the center of creation for Dakota people and also sacred to Ojibwe. The congregation acknowledges that this land was taken from Indigenous people by exploitation and violence. Given the deep significance of this sacred ground, as well as its painful history, the congregation recognizes its responsibility to use this land, its building and mission for the work of reconciliation and healing with Native people. The congregation repents of this injustice that continues to harm Native communities and pledges to work for justice, peace and the wellbeing of all creation.
